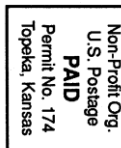

Infant & Child CPR and First Aid

SIDS and the Child Care Setting

Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) in the child care setting is a traumatic event for everyone. This presentation will focus on what SIDS is and what it is not, ways to reduce the risk of SIDS in the child care setting, how to handle an emergency, and helping yourself and others cope with SIDS.
