



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

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### **2006 Washington County Child Care Data Highlights**

- Cost of one infant and one preschooler in family child care represents 17.9% of the median family income
- 45.5% of the children referred were from families receiving SRS subsidies
- 75.1% of families had all parents in the household working
- 40.9% of children referred needed care during alternative hours

### **2008 Washington County Census Facts**

- Population = 5,791, this is a 10.7% decrease from April 2000
- 21% of the population are under 18 years of age
- 5.2% of the population are under 5 years of age
- Median household income in 2007 was \$36,707
- 11.4% of the population are living below poverty (2007)

### **Kansas Facts of Interest as of 2009**

- There are 152,967 Single parent households in Kansas
- 97,808 families with both parents in the household, still have both parents working outside the home
- Average annual fees paid for an infant in a full time child care center arraignment = \$9,139
- Average annual fees paid for an infant in a full time family child care home arraignment = \$6,012
- Average annual tuition and fees paid for a 4-year state college = \$6,141
- Number of child care workers in Kansas, 5,620
- Average income for full-time, year round child care provider - \$17,210
